ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER JB-05-19 (A. 9-11)

**DEADLINE FOR FILING PETITION FOR EMANCIPATION
WHEN AN ATTORNEY IS ASSIGNED BY THE COURT
TO REPRESENT THE PETITIONER**

Effective: September 19, 2011

This order amends JB-05-19 (A. 7-10), signed July 1, 2010, and effective July 1, 2010.

Pursuant to 15 M.R.S. § 3506-A, upon the written request filed with the clerk's office by a juvenile sixteen years of age or older requesting that the court appoint or assign counsel for the juvenile for the purpose of filing a petition for emancipation of the juvenile, the court shall assign counsel. The assigned counsel shall file a Petition for Emancipation within thirty days of receiving notice of the assignment, or the matter is subject to dismissal by the court at the request of the clerk without further notice to counsel or the juvenile and without prejudice.
