

Agent Bosco spoke with Probation Officer Sam Payson. PO Payson requested a search of Cutler's person, hotel room and vehicle, in the presence of Cutler. I searched the bag that Cutler was concealing and found it to be the covers to dvd containers, detailing various nude images of adults engaged in sex acts. Cutler himself was holding several empty dvd containers that had both the dvd and the covers removed. PO Payson advised that Cutler was not allowed to possess any pornography at all. PO Payson authorized a hold of Cutler under the offense of a probation violation. I placed Cutler in handcuffs behind his back, checking for proper tightness and locking to avoid any tightening.

Agent Bosco seized these and other items of evidence per PO Payson's request and per Cutler's probation conditions. Agent Bosco and I then escorted Cutler outside to his parked Chevrolet Tahoe, ME PC 760JNB. I unlocked the Tahoe with the keys found on Cutler's person. Agent Bosco and I searched the vehicle, finding no further evidence.

On February 9, 2026, I and other members of the Maine State Police Special Victims Unit were conducting search warrant executions in Cumberland County. At the end of my day I arrived at the Double Tree hotel in South Portland. As I was gathering my belongings I observed an older male whom I recognized to be Eliot Cutler. As Mr. Cutler was walking towards me from the hotel I could see he was carrying a brown paper bag and a stack of black DVD cases in his right hand. I stepped up on the sidewalk from my car and said how are you Mr. Cutler of which he responded good and who are you. I said I was Jason Bosco from the Maine State Police. After I said this, Mr. Cutler then moved the bag and DVD cases behind his back. I asked Mr. Cutler if he was still on probation and he said he was. I asked who his probation officer was and he said Sam Payson. I asked Mr. Cutler if he was subject to search and he said he didn't think so. I said well what would PO Payson have to say about that and asked him what he was hiding behind his back. Mr. Cutler said nothing, I don't have anything. I said, my guess is that its something you are not supposed to have. Mr. Cutler then started to weep and said yes I messed up, please don't do this please don't do this. I asked what he had and he finally showed me and said he bought some pornography on DVDs. Mr. Cutler began to loudly cry and say he cant help himself and that he has had this problem for 65 years. I asked Mr. Cutler to set his things on my car and to have a seat on the hood. I asked Mr. Cutler if he had anything else or if he had anything in his room. Mr. Cutler said he had more DVDs in his room. I then called Sgt. Bagley and asked if he could come outside to help me out.

Sgt. Bagley arrived and I asked if he had Sam Payson's contact info which he did. I called and spoke with PO Payson and explained the above situation. PO Payson explained Mr. Cutlers conditions and said that he would be putting a hold on him. PO Payson then asked that we search his room and asked that Mr. Cutler be present during the search.

Mr. Cutler cooperated with this process and gave me his room key. Mr. Cutler came up to his room where Sgt. Bagley, Sgt. Joshua Lander, Cpl, Chris Smith and his K9 Doc and I went into Room #706 to search. While searching we found 10 adult pornographic DVD's and a DVD player that was connected to the hotel TV. I photographed the items and collected them as evidence.

Sgt. Bagley then transported Mr. Cutler to jail.
