

Hearing on the Defendant's petition for determination of bail was held on October 31, 2024. The Defendant was present with counsel. The petition was filed pursuant to 15 M.R.S. § 1028 (2024) and M.R. U. Crim. P. 46(d). Under those provisions, the court determines bail de novo—that is, with no weight to be given to bail orders issued previously in this case.

The court's determination of bail is governed by the considerations set out by the Legislature in the Bail Code. As relevant here, principal among those considerations are public safety and reasonably ensuring the Defendant's appearance in court as required. *See* 15 M.R.S. § 1002.

The court has considered the parties' presentations at the October 31 hearing, including written material submitted by the Defendant, and the contents of the probable-cause affidavit. The principal point of disagreement between the parties is the amount of cash bail that would be proper. There are secondary issues regarding the conditions of release, as a function of the amount of cash bail.

The salient information in the record includes evidence that the Defendant committed a crime of violence that resulted in the alleged victim's death. The Defendant is charged with manslaughter, a Class A crime, punishable by a lengthy term of incarceration. The Defendant has some connection to Maine, but that connection is not substantial or long-standing. Also relevant, however, is the absence of any criminal history for the Defendant and strong support for the Defendant by members of his family, who have deep and established connections to the Defendant's hometown community.

Given these factors and others developed by the parties, bail will be \$50,000 cash. The conditions of release will be:

-before being released, the Defendant shall enter into a supervision contract with Maine Pretrial Services;

-the Defendant shall live at a residence in Knox County approved by MPTS;

-the Defendant shall be subject to house arrest with exceptions to attend medical appointments, appointments with his attorney, court appearances, and employment;

-the Defendant shall participate in electronic GPS monitoring;

-the Defendant shall not travel or be present outside Knox County without prior written approval by the court, which may include the imposition of additional conditions of release to be in effect when the Defendant is outside Knox County;

-the Defendant shall have no direct contact with any person younger than 18 years old except that he may have contact with his biological children only by electronic means and not in-person; and

-the Defendant shall have no direct or indirect contact with Shaneka Washington (dob 8/29/99) and shall not be present where she lives, works, or goes to school.
