An appeal has been filed. Pursuant to the Maine Rules of Civil Procedure, the briefing schedule for the appeal in this Court is as follows:

**M.R. Civ. P. 80B Appeal of Governmental Actions**

The plaintiff's brief is due 40 days after (mm/dd/yyyy) \_\_\_\_\_, which is the date on which the complaint was filed in this Court. Unless otherwise required by statute, it is the plaintiff's responsibility to submit the record of the proceedings on or before the date that the plaintiff's brief is filed.

The defendant's brief is due 30 days after service of the brief by the plaintiff.

The plaintiff has 14 days after service of the brief by defendant to file a reply brief.

**M.R. Civ. P. 80C Appeal of Final Agency Actions**

The petitioner's brief is due 40 days after (mm/dd/yyyy) 3/26/2024, which is the date on which the state agency record was filed in this Court. *7/1/24 5M 5/20/24*

The respondent's brief is due 30 days after service of the brief by the petitioner.

The petitioner has 14 days after service of the brief by respondent to file a reply brief.

**M.R. Civ. P. 76G Appeal of District Court Civil Action**

The appellant's brief is due 40 days after (mm/dd/yyyy) \_\_\_\_\_, which is the date on which the District Court Record was filed in this Court.

The appellee's brief is due 30 days after service of the brief by the appellant.

The appellant shall have 14 days after service of the brief by appellee to file a reply brief.

The clerk of court will schedule oral argument for the first appropriate date after the appeal is in order for hearing.
